A Look Back at 2025

With just 6 full-time clinical and social services staff, our team:

Cared for over 370 patients and their whānau.	Completed 2,140 home visits, bringing compassionate care to our patients' doorsteps.	Answered 6,195 phone calls, providing support and guidance.
Responded to 1,484 after- hours calls to ensure care is available 24/7.	Supported 209 families with bereavement care following the passing of a loved one.	Provided 3,455 pieces of advice to other health professionals, helping increase palliative care capability in the Franklin region.

Together, our team and supporters have brought care, comfort, and guidance to hundreds of patients and whānau across our community this year.
